

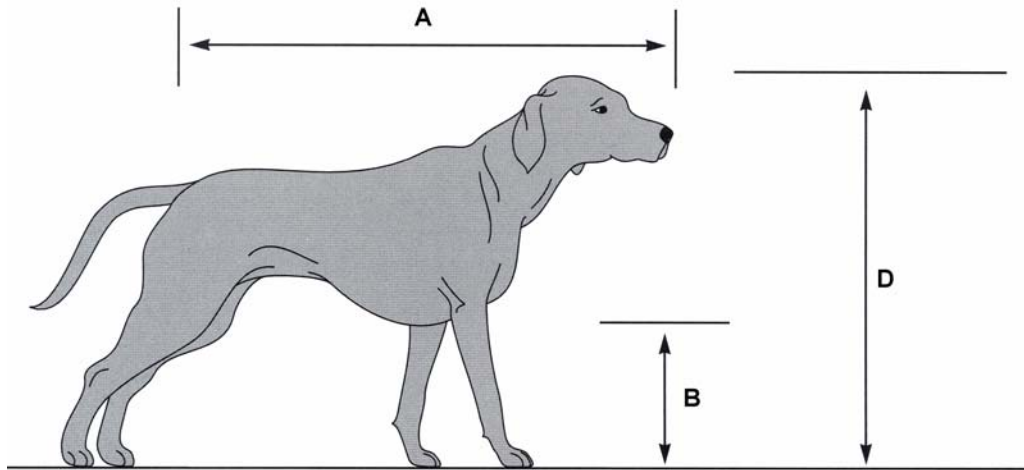

MEASUREMENT GUIDE FOR DOG AND CAT CONTAINERS

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the International Air Transport Association (IATA) require that containers used to transport dogs and cats be large enough to allow each animal to turn about normally while standing, to stand and sit erect, and to lay in a natural position.

Use this measurement guide to ensure your kennel is large enough to comply with these regulations.



- A** = Length of the animal from the nose to the root of the tail
- B** = Length of a front leg from the ground to the elbow
- C** = Width across the shoulders (not shown)
- D** = Height of the animal in a standing position with its head erect.
(For animals with erect ears, measure from the ground to the top of the ear.)

(Round all measurements up to the nearest full inch or centimeter)

Minimum Container Dimensions Are:

LENGTH = $A + \frac{1}{2} B$

WIDTH = $C \times 2$ (one animal) **OR**
 $C \times 3$ (two animals)

HEIGHT = D

Maximum Interior Dimensions for Dorskocil Kennels

(all dimensions are in inches. one inch = 2.54 centimeters)

Small	18L	x	13W	x	13H
Medium	23L	x	16W	x	17H
Intermediate	28L	x	17W	x	20H
Large	30L	x	19W	x	25H
Extra-Large	34L	x	21W	x	27H
Giant	40L	x	25W	x	32H
